The Paint-Ins are such a wonderful way to become acquainted with our WAS-H teachers. We try to introduce a variety of teachers with different styles, approaches, techniques and materials employed in creating a watercolor painting. All of us have our own uniqueness, which may be enhanced with this kind of exposure. A one-day class for only \$30 per session is indeed a bargain.

The 2010-2011 Paint-In featured or will feature these very talented artists:

- September: Sam Caldwell led the class in making the ordinary dynamic, using color as his tool. The subject was a rooster, as nature (landscapes and wildlife) are his subjects of choice.

February 2011 Demo with Barbara Jeffery Clay

Barbara's love of painting, along with her masterful use of color, captivated WAS-H



members and guests alike during our February demo. To bring out the vibrant color and brilliance of her flowers, she painted the lights and darks in analogous colors. She achieved her lights by changing color rather than diluting a color. Her color palette for the flowers consisted of the white of the paper, yellow, vermilion, permanent rose, and alizarin crimson.

Keeping the flower or focal point with the most detail as well as contrast of beautiful

color, she then painted the leaves in less detail, with softer edges, in order not to draw as much attention as the flowers. With thoughtful placement of transparent color next to opaque, and the completion of the final details and background, the drama and beauty of the hibiscus flower emerged as Barbara visually captured the emotion of her joyful experience of nature in this exciting painting.

Opening March 19, the 34th International Exhibition hosted by the Watercolor Art Society – Houston will be a memorable display of current aesthetic trends and the impeccable taste of John Salminen. Once again, Houston has the opportunity to host an outstanding collection of works on paper that emphasize the dramatic effects of water-media. Nothing will be described as too real or too abstract or too colorful or too dull – the full range of watercolor techniques will be on display at the 34th International Exhibition. So, in the words of the medieval barker, “Come ye to the faire!”

While many exhibitions can be freighted with heady texts – catalogs, exhibition guides, takeaway broadsheets and wall-mounted statements – the 34th International Exhibition will be an exposition on creativity. But rather than just revisiting clichéd themes and

sentimental explorations of the past, the internationally recognized juror who has been selected to orchestrate the show, John Salminen, is responsible for crafting an exhibition, creating a whole from the many disparate parts which comprise this iteration of the WAS-H International Exhibition.

Come Ye to the Faire! Come and be delighted! Come and be impressed! Come and be entertained by talent! The success of the 34th International Exhibition will be on display from March 19 until April 15. The many award-winning paintings will be on display for a full month. And, of course, everyone is invited, to attend the opening reception on March 25.

With such broad themes and encyclopedic techniques, the 34th International Exhibition is educational and informative, but it is hardly a visual lecture, although such a goal seems laudable. The true purpose is an exploration of freedom and the possibility of art. But don't take my word for it ... see for yourself! Come to the Faire! ☺

teaching art part time.

Joanie's enthusiasm was contagious as she demonstrated her expertise with pen and ink. The class made a grid and used tracing paper to transfer a subject to paper. She handed out many subjects for us to copy and color: trees,

birds, branches (make them loose and uneven), buildings and windows. For windows she suggested partially filling in some panes and adding color to others. Leave something to the imagination; don't tell everything. Joanie paints very quickly with dabs of color, then goes back and fills in. She used a small brush with a great point. A kneaded eraser was recommended, and good paper. It was a most enjoyable day. ☺

February's Gallery Show was small (37 entries) but was a very strong show that showed good use of the medium. The juror, Ellen Orseck, said she was looking for the emotional component. I think she was able to find the right component, because she selected 1st-2nd-and 3rd-place winners and also awarded seven honorable mentions.

First Place was awarded to **Jackie Liddell** for *Sea Self Portrait*. The artist framed the image in a unique way. The painting had good emotional content and an intensity of color.



Second Place went to **Erik Sprohge** for *Used to be Place*. You could feel the temperature and sense the age of the wood and the energy in the tree. The use of color made the painting come alive.



Third Place was given to **Eileen O'Sullivan** for *Misplaced Migration*. The artist wows you with the intensity of orange and then you see the added material collaged into the picture. It made you feel as if nature had been replicated.

Juror: Keith McNay – Keith McNay has a degree in Graphic Design from Stephen F. Austin State University. His paintings have sold across the United States and Mexico. He sells through four Texas galleries. A group of his paintings hang in the board room of Houston Halliburton.

Eligibility and Requirements

- Artist must be a current WAS-H member.
- Up to three entries per artist.
- Fee of \$10 per entry.
- Artwork Regulations:
 - Original composition.
 - Completed in the last 24 months.
 - Not painted under supervision or in a class.
 - At least 80% watermedia.
 - Surfaces: paper, Claybord, or Yupo only.
 - Has not won a WAS-H award.
- Framing Regulations:
 - Frames must be plain, simple grooves only
 - Frame width must not exceed 1½"
 - White or off-white mats and liners
 - Must be strung with wire for hanging.
 - Plexiglas, if glass is needed.
 - Frame not to exceed 48" in height or width.

Awards

- Cash awards for first \$100, second \$75, third \$50.
- Honorable Mentions awarded a ribbon – no cash.
- Only one award per artist.
- Winners are notified by phone.

Sales

- WAS-H accepts a 20% donation for sale of artwork.
- All artwork must remain in gallery for duration of the show.
- Artwork price is to include sales tax.
- A 5% fee is taken out of credit card sales.
- All sales include frames.

Liability

WAS-H will not be liable for damage before, during or after the exhibit. Artwork that adheres to these guidelines will be accepted with the provision that WAS-H reserves the right to refuse any entries that are inappropriate for a family venue.

WAS-H's Web Site Creates New Wave of Interest

Dave and Carrie Maloney, our WAS-H webmasters, can be proud of their work behind the scenes. A lady wrote to WAS-H recently asking about Edith Kirkpatrick, whom she discovered was among WAS-H's 11 founding member-artists along with Faber McMullen, Judy Gard and others. She wrote an email seeking information on the artist and described how she went to the Internet for a search. Her googling resulted in finding WAS-H's Web Site and the August 2010 *Washrag* that carried Margaret Bock's first article on our early beginnings in 1969. (That is the only place where Edith Kirkpatrick is referenced. At that point, the search also led her to WAS-H's email address, and this is what she wrote:

*To whoever can help me,
I was researching a painting I had*

reframed because the owner of the shop said he couldn't find anything on the artist – I "googled" Edith Kirkpatrick and found the newsletter and discovered she was a founding member of the society – so sorry I didn't know when you were celebrating the beginning of the society. My parents had great friends in Houston and would visit them every year from Pennsylvania and one year they brought home this watercolour by Kirkpatrick. It hung over our baby grand and I inherited it. I would appreciate any information you might have on Ms. Kirkpatrick to share with my framer and to share with my children.

Later I replied and sent her a link to the February *Washrag* that featured photos of the Founding-Charter Members Exhibit last November. . . and she wrote again:

Thank you for your reply. I live in Houston and so does the painting – a still life painted in '69. Thank you for asking for more information also – I will plan on coming to your sale in April and enjoy more wonderful watercolours!

And isn't this "sale in April" none

other than the Clothesline Sale? You see how one thing leads to another...one person leads to another person...one painting leads to WAS-H's Web Site... one link leads to another link...and so on and on. Dave and Carrie,; thanks for your expertise and highly skilled efforts! There will be more human interest stories like this because of our Web site and availability on the Net...Happy surfing, everyone!
